  - Running an online course on peeragogy is fun
  - Floobits<sup>17</sup> is a nice online tool for editing the handbook that connects directly to GitHub, although it is not the most user friendly for everyone
- 4. What else should we change going forward?
  - Keep improving how we learn and produce things collaboratively!
